Laureates

ANTHONY R. GUERRERO, JR.

Tony Guerrero or “Ants” as he is known from his beach boy days grew up in the Kapahulu area on Oahu. He graduated from St. Louis School’s Class of 1963; received his B.A. (Industrial Management) from the University of Portland and began his banking career at First Hawaiian Bank as a management trainee in 1967.



After 42 years of service, Tony Guerrero retired from First Hawaiian Bank in January, 2010. As Vice Chairman and Group Manager, Retail Banking Group, he was responsible for the management of 63 bank branches, and the retail areas of Sales & Service Division, Japan Business Development, Service Delivery, Call Center, Retail Information & Planning, and the Business Banking & Wealth Management Group. Tony enjoyed the operations side of the bank and introduced First Hawaiian’s distinctive service culture to the branches. Living lokahi—working together—and kina’ole—doing the right thing.

Kina’ole--doing the right thing is the reason Tony is active with numerous community organizations. He served as President of Friends of Hawaii Charities (Host of the Sony Open in Hawaii) for 11 years, raising over \$11M; he is Chairman of the Oahu Transit Services Inc. (The Bus); Board President of Waianae Coast Comprehensive Health Center; Vice President of UH’s Na Koa Football Club and continues to be a director for: Hawaii Community Foundation, East-West Center Foundation; Trust in Public Lands’ Hawaiian Island Program and others. Tony was named to the Honolulu County Sports Commission by Mayor Mufi Hannemann. He served as the former Chairman of the Board of the Stadium Authority, Child & Family Service, Hawaii Visitors & Convention Bureau, UH Ahahui Koa Avenue and the St. Louis Education Foundation and President of the Waialae Country Club.

Tony was named the Sales and Marketing Executives of Honolulu’s 2004 Salesperson of the Year and awarded the Small Business Administration’s 1999 Small Business Financial Services Advocate of the Year for the City and County of Honolulu.

He is a frequent speaker at high schools, sharing his story of his Waikiki beach boy days, and the importance of staying in school and being drug-free. He’s an avid waterman and an accomplished paddler (crossing the Molokai Channel over 20 times and a Hokulea crewman), a paddle boarder, surfer, and fisherman.

DR. TYRIE LEE JENKINS

Dr. Tyrie Lee Jenkins comes from a long line of strong, service-minded women. Her great-great grandmother was a midwife in rural Pennsylvania and her great grandmother was a nurse. Her grandmother and grandfather were M.D.s and medical missionaries in Katmandu, Nepal. Her mother is a nursing instructor at the University of Delaware. Her daughter, Annie Hiller, is in pre-med, taking the family medicine women into the sixth generation.



She has been practicing ophthalmology in Hawai’i for nearly two decades and refractive surgery for 13 years. She is one of the state’s premier anterior segment and laser refractive surgeons. Her thriving practice reflects her business acumen, passion and skill. It’s also built on a philosophy of community responsibility.

Besides her own practice, Tyrie Jenkins, M.D. Eye Care, (opened in 1996), she is medical director of the Laser Eye Center, Hawai’i’s first locally owned center devoted to laser refractive surgery; she co-owns The Surgical Suites, a freestanding outpatient surgery center.

Dr. Jenkins was a national early adopter in laser vision correction. She was active in the study that led to the FDA approval of LASIK and performed Hawai’i’s first LASIK procedure in 1997. She regularly participates in ongoing research in her field.

As part of several medical missions, she has helped improved access to eye care in underserved areas. She measures success not in profits alone but in community good.

She is currently working on her Masters in Public Health from the Bloomberg School of Public Health at Johns Hopkins University.

She established Na Kauka for the Cure (Doctors for the Cure™) as part of the Komen Breast Cancer Foundation’s annual Race for the Cure™. She’s president of the Women’s Fund of Hawaii, which makes grants to grassroots programs, and on the board of Hawaii Public Radio.

Dr. Jenkins has been recognized by Pacific Business News, U.S. Small Business Administration and the YWCA. In 2009 she was named one of the top-rated physicians in her field in Hawai’i by her peers—fellow physicians in the top five percent of medical practitioners across the nation. She and her husband George are proud of their four children Douglas 27, Lindsay 25, Annie 24 and Mollie 23.

BARRY K. TANIGUCHI

Barry K. Taniguchi was born and raised in Hilo, Hawaii. He graduated from Hilo High School (1965); the University of Hawaii Hilo (1967); and the University of Hawaii Manoa (1969), received his Certified Public Accountant Certificate (1971). He received the Hilo High School Distinguished Alumnus Award (2007); UH Hilo Distinguished Service Award (2005); UH Manoa Outstanding Alumnus Award (2004). He was inducted to the UH College of Business Administration Hall of Honor (2003) and the Hawaii Society of CPAs Business & Industry Hall of Fame (2005).



He set out on his own, working for Haskins and Sells (now Deloitte & Touche), as a senior accountant. He worked for Realty Investment Company as vice president and controller. He joined National Car Rental Hawaii, as vice president of finance. He joined KTA in 1983, as president and chief executive officer of KTA Super Stores and K. Taniguchi, Ltd. KTA’s succeeds in promoting local products and giving back to the community. KTA sponsors hundreds of community activities on the Big Island. Schools, youth organizations, senior citizen programs, and athletic groups, have all benefited from KTA’s generosity.
