Junior Achievement is courses in **Financial Literacy, Work Readiness & Entrepreneurship**, taught one class period per week, usually within **Social Studies, Business or Family & Consumer Science**. JA is an interactive experience, with workbooks, games, puzzles, posters, role-playing and group activities. The students **have fun** while they learn **concepts, skills and learning standards**, many required by MCAS, and while they develop **critical thinking, teamwork and problem solving skills**.

The "teacher" is a **businessperson** trained by JA, who is volunteering his/her time with the consent of their workplace. Volunteers can also be parents recruited through PTOs, or college students studying to be professionals, or retirees, etc.

All JA volunteers add their personal experiences from the world of work to the course lessons. For the 2009-10 school year, 287 local teachers in 73 schools received JA for their students.
